OUCH! Serving as a Good Bad Example Accidents

Lee Stearns was scroll sawing some Christmas ornaments. This one was a 3D figure with the middle of one cut very close to the edge of the wood. The blade popped out of the wood and into her thumb. Three stitches. Lessons learned:

- Be careful of mundane things. This was a mundane cut.
- For this kind of cutting, hold the wood with a wooden clamp.
- I've been having the grandson of a friend do scroll saw work in my shop. Maybe that's a bad idea.
