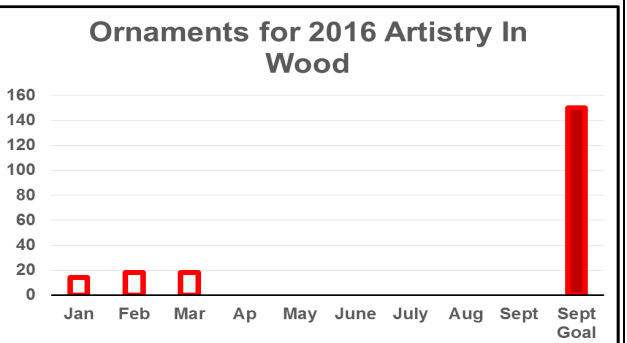
April Show & Tell
