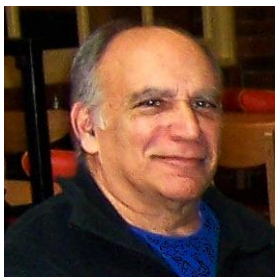
We are to clean up the chips, put tables and chairs back, and depart prior to 8:30.
